LOCATION: Gallaudet's campus is located in Washington, DC, a short distance from the US Capitol, the National Mall, the Smithsonian Institution, and numerous cultural and educational offerings of the city. The 99-acre campus, known as Kendall Green, is home to both undergraduate and graduate programs, several research units, and the Laurent Clerc National Deaf Education Center, a federally supported P-12 demonstration program with a national mission to improve the academic achievement of deaf and hard of hearing students across the nation.

The Graduate School at Gallaudet University draws on Gallaudet's rich heritage, distinguished faculty and staff, and ASL-English bilingual environment to carry out its multifaceted mission to:

1. prepare deaf, hard of hearing, and hearing scholars, leaders, and practitioners from diverse backgrounds to excel in their professions and disciplines; and
2. generate knowledge, via research and other scholarly activities to inform theory and practice in the professions and disciplines represented by graduate programs.

The knowledge, skills, and dispositions addressed in the various graduate programs are aligned with professional accreditation standards as well as the Graduate School's own high academic expectations.

➤ ACCREDITATION

Gallaudet University is accredited by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education. Our graduate programs are also accredited by professional accrediting bodies, including: the American Psychological Association (APA); American Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA); Council on Accreditation of Counseling and Related Programs (CACREP); Council on Education of the Deaf (CED); Council on Social Work Education (CSWE); and National Association of School Psychologists (NASP). Programs that prepare graduates to be licensed professionals in schools are also approved by the District of Columbia State Education Agency. These same programs, along with the Ed.S. in Change Leadership in Education, are part of Gallaudet's Professional Education Unit which is accredited by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE).

➤ INCLUSIVE BILINGUALISM

Gallaudet University has been a bilingual university since it was chartered by Abraham Lincoln in 1864, with American Sign Language (ASL) and English the primary languages of social and academic discourse. In 2007, the university adopted a new mission statement explicitly embracing inclusive bilingualism.
